If you have a computer, like I do, you probably have email and get bombarded with all kinds of solicitations, forwards and just plain old "junk" mail, as I do, both on my computer and fax. I usually delete most of this stuff without evening looking at it. However, one article caught my eye which was a forward from one of our past Grand Masters of California. It speaks to not only all Americans, but the world in general, especially those who dislike Americans. And given what's been happening in the world, the threats against our Countrymen, wherever they may be, I felt this article was still as relevant as it was when I first used it six years ago. Below is the article:

"What Is An American? You probably missed it in the rush of the news last week, but there was actually a report that someone in Pakistan had published in a newspaper an offer or a reward to anyone who killed an American, any American. So an Australian dentist wrote the following to let everyone know what an American is, so they would know one when they found one. An American is English, or French, or Italian, Irish, German, Spanish, Polish, Russian or Greek."

"An American may also be Canadian, Mexican, African, Indian, Chinese, Japanese, Australian, Iranian, Asian, or Arab, or Pakistani, or Afghan. An American may also be a Cherokee, Osage, Blackfoot, Navaho, Apache, or one of the many other tribes known as native Americans."

"An American is Christian, or he could be Jewish, or Buddhist, or Muslim. In fact, there are more Muslims in America than in Afghanistan. The only difference is that in America they are free to worship as each of them chooses. An American is also free to believe in no religion. For that he will answer only to God, not to the government, or to armed thugs claiming to speak for the government and for God."

"An American is from the most prosperous land in the history of the world. The root of that prosperity can be found in the Declaration of Independence, which recognizes the God given right of each man and woman to the pursuit of happiness. An American is generous. Americans have helped out just about every other nation in the world in their time of need. When Afghanistan was overrun by the Soviet army 20 years ago, Americans came with arms and supplies to enable the people to win back their country. As of the morning of September 11th, Americans had given more than any other nation to the poor of Afghanistan. Americans welcome the best, the best products, the best books, the best music, the best food, the best athletes.

But they also welcome the least. The national symbol of America, The Statue of Liberty, welcomes your tired and your poor, the wretched refuse of your teeming shores, the homeless, tempest tossed. These in fact are the people who built America."

"Some of them were working in the Twin Towers the morning of September 11th, earning a better life for their families. I've been told that the World Trade Center victims were from at least 30 other countries, cultures, and first languages, including those that aided and abetted the terrorists."

"So you can try to kill an American if you must. Hitler did. So did General Tojo, and Stalin, and Mao Tse-Tung, and every bloodthirsty tyrant in the history of the world. But, in doing so you would just be killing yourself." Because Americans are not a particular people from a particular place. They are the embodiment of the human Spirit of Freedom. Everyone who holds to that Spirit, everywhere, is an American."

### FROM THE SOUTH

**Greetings Brethren!** 

Here now my words for reflexion, as they pertain to thoughts on secrecy:

The emphasis to maintain secrecy, both in the charges of our obligations and by iterated inculcations in our rituals, is likely to produce attitudes on the parts of those who embrace the call to conceal and of those who view us from

the outer ports our spiritual community. Lest the true purpose be misunderstood, we should eschew the idea that secrecy, as we practice it, is an outgrowth of oppression, even though the penalty for negligence is great. Neither should we be disturbed by others who would claim that it is rooted in a disposition for superiority. Consider the words of the Master when lecturing to the newly created Master Mason, and when referring to the Book of Constitutions, guarded by the Tyler's Sword:

"The Book of Constitutions, guarded by the Tyler's Sword, reminds us that we should be ever watchful and guarded in our thoughts, words and actions, particularly when before the enemies of freemasonry [or the uninitiated], ever bearing in remembrance those truly Masonic virtues, Silence and Circumspection."

Certainly, we recognize the right of members of our order to practice their work in privacy, and we carefully preserve that right. Yet this is still secondary to the pursuit of discovery in a world not detectable to the ordinary senses: Brightness out of darkness and the tenor of a silent world; for these are sublime conditions that would be rendered impotent to the mind if polluted by anticipation.

The words of the Master must be contrasted with the words of Thomas Gray who in a Churchyard Elegy wrote:

"Full many a flower is born to blush unseen And waste its sweetness on the desert air." "Full many a gem of purest ray serene, The dark unfathomed caves of ocean bear."

The overt meaning of these lines would suggest that many have been neglected who might contribute to humanity and to the world. This is, of course, sadly true and is probably what Gray had in mind when he penned them. Yet such an interpretation does not consider that pollination, not requiring human scrutiny, leads to perpetuated life and that transpollination leads to new forms. Like the gems under the shadow of our own death, their time will come, if not during our possible return to earth, for the benefit of our posterity who may one day realize their potency.

#### FROM THE BEE HIVE


We would like to welcome our newest Bees, Kennedy and Georgia.
