The Brethren will hold those Offices until our annual installation in January.

One more item, the July and August Trestleboards will be combined into one Trestleboard. Now, on to my topic.

I used to take my clothes to a Dry Cleaner owned by a lovely married Korean couple. They moved and I lost contact with them for about 4 years.

When I took over as Secretary of the Los Angeles Scottish Rite, I would pass a Dry Cleaning Store near the office as I drove to work. One day I decided to give them a try, mostly out of convenience. To my pleasant surprise, they were the same people I used to do business with, and now, have re-continued bringing my business to them again.

On Tuesday morning, February 5th, I stopped by to drop off my clothes for dry cleaning. There were several people waiting for service and the customer who was being waited on was picking up and paying for his laundry when I heard the owner of the Cleaners say, "You only owe me one dollar, your bill was 21 dollars, but you left a 20 dollar bill in your pants pocket". I smiled and looked at the customer and said, "How many Cleaners do you know who would return money they found in a customers pocket?" He replied, "I'm always forgetting to clean out my pockets and she (one of the owners) gives it back to me, now she just deducts the amount she finds from my bill. I've left as much as a 100 dollars in my pockets, but I never have to worry because I know I'm dealing with honest people".

I looked around at the expressions on the faces of the customers waiting to be served, and to a person, they were surprised.

It's not often that you hear about someone's honesty in business, especially from another person who has nothing to gain for the compliment.

Honesty is an attribute of integrity and covers a large area, honesty in business, in our personal relations, with ourselves and with our commitments. In the scenario I mentioned above, my Cleaners could have kept the money, never said anything, and the customer wouldn't know anything except that he misplaced some money somewhere. Had the Cleaner done this, wouldn't they be putting a price on their honesty, which is really putting a price on their integrity?

What price would you put on your Integrity? As Masons, it's not for sale, whether it's for making a buck or for breaking our word or commitment, as in our Obligations --- it's just not for sale.


